


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# Use photographs of yourself from multiple viewpoints to experiment with ideas.



- Try out at least three different ideas.

your own style. Make it fun.











Using cut out and collage allows you a lot of flexibility. Plus, using materials to think can help you understand how it looks.



OPTIONAL : Use some modeling clay and an action figure to really understand all three dimensions.
